• JCU Undergrads

- Students from a number of different departments can elect to take the five courses as electives.
- Students will be assisted in locating a site for the field experience.
- Students can be in the field accruing the 2,000 hours required for licensure from the moment they enter the program.
- After completing the first four courses, students can apply for the CDCA. This would allow them to seek employment in the field and continue to accrue hours towards LCDC II or LCDC III licensure.
- Once the hours are completed, students would take the test administered by the state. If they pass the test, they are awarded the license.

• Individuals with an Associate's Degree in a Behavioral Science or Nursing

- Applicants will sign-up for the five-course program of study.
- Students will be assisted in locating a site for the field experience.
- Students can be in the field accruing the 2,000 hours required for licensure from the moment they enter the program.
- After completing the first four courses, students can apply for the CDCA. This would allow them to seek employment in the field and continue to accrue hours towards LCDC II licensure.
- Once the hours are completed, students would take the test administered by the state. If they pass the test, they are awarded the license.
- We would also attempt to get these students to enroll at JCU and complete their bachelor's degree.

• Individuals with a Bachelor's Degree

- Applicants will sign-up for the five-course program of study.
- Students will be assisted in locating a site for the field experience.
- Students can be in the field accruing the 2,000 hours required for licensure from the moment they enter the program.
- After completing the first four courses, students can apply for the CDCA. This would allow them to seek employment in the field and continue to accrue hours towards LCDC II (If their bachelor's degree is not in a behavioral science or nursing) or LCDC III licensure (if their bachelor's degree is in a behavioral science or nursing).
- Once the hours are completed, students would take the test administered by the state. If they pass the test, they are awarded the license.
- We would also attempt to get these students to enroll in the master's program in counseling at JCU.
- Individuals with a Master's Degree in a Behavioral Science (with documentation of coursework in the ten specific content areas).

- Applicants will sign-up for the five-course program of study.
- Students will be assisted in locating a site for the field experience.
- Students can be in the field accruing the 2,000 hours required for licensure from the moment they enter the program.
- After completing the first four courses, students can apply for the CDCA. This would allow them to seek employment in the field and continue to accrue hours towards the LICDC.
