

**Senate Resolution (REC)2-F20**

October 20, 2020

**Intent and Purpose:** To ask all John Carroll professors to record all Zoom lectures to Canvas, use the designated Canvas tabs for their intended purpose, and allow flexibility in students watching class lectures asynchronously.

---

**Noting**, that the COVID-19 pandemic has led to virtual learning for the entirety of the Fall 2020 semester, and

**Noting**, that it is likely there will be a Hy-Flex model for the Spring 2021 semester including some virtual learning, and

**Noting**, that the Student Government published a virtual learning survey asking students to answer questions regarding their experience with virtual learning and provide any feedback on what could improve the virtual learning experience, and

**Noting**, that from those students who left feedback on the survey, common trends for improving virtual learning included:

1. Having all lectures recorded for students to access after class
2. Having a coherent Canvas set-up for all classes so all assignments, links, and syllabi are easily accessible
3. Allowing students to watch synchronous classes asynchronously without penalty for attendance, and

**Recognizing**, that according to Article II, Section 1, Subsection F of the General Bylaws, recommendations are “Bills making suggestions to the university administration or faculty,” and

**Therefore be it resolved**, the John Carroll Student Government asks all professors to record all Zoom lectures, organize Canvas pages according to the proscribed tabs, and allow students to watch lectures asynchronously in order to improve student experience with virtual learning.
